

REQUIREMENTS FOR SHIPMENT OF HUMAN REMAINS/URN TO THE PHILIPPINES

A CONSULAR MORTUARY CERTIFICATE SHALL BE ISSUED UPON SUBMISSION OF THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS.

1. International Certificate of Death issued by the Standesamt;
2. Medical Report of Death (Leichenshauschein) issued by the hospital/coroner
3. A duly notarized Certificate from the Mortuary/Funeral Director/Crematorium stating:
 - That the body was properly embalmed/cremated in accordance with internationally accepted health practices.
 - That it is in a sanitary condition consistent with existing standards for overseas shipment, and
 - That the casket/urn has been hermetically sealed and contains only the remains of the deceased,
4. A Certificate from the hospital or health authority stating that the deceased did not die of a contagious disease or that the remains to be shipped did not originate from a place contaminated by a contagious disease;
5. For shipment of casket of human remains, please submit the following:
 - A transit permit issued by the proper health authority at the place where transportation begins
 - Copy of Airway Bill and Flight Details
6. Complete Address of Consignee in the Philippines
7. Original Passport of the deceased;
8. If the deceased is a Filipino national, please accomplish the Report of Death Form and attached two (2) originals of the International Death Certificate.
8. Documentation Fees
 - Fee for the issuance of the Consular Mortuary Certificate: Euro 25,00
 - Fee for issuance of the Report of Death (for deceased Filipinos): Euro 25,00
 - Additional Fee if applying for Delayed Report of Death: Euro 25,00
